The elephant *symbol of Côte d'Ivoire*

It is the national animal emblem. The country's name was inspired by its tusks in ivory, since it's the largest animal found in Côte d'Ivoire. On the coat of arms, the elephant's head is drawn in profile highlighting one of its tusks on a green escutcheon surrounded by two palm trees and surmounted by a rising sun.

The players of the national team are called "The Elephants" and they are three-time soccer African champions 1992 - 2015 - 2024. Being the host country of AFCON 2023, Côte d'Ivoire has organized the best ever Hospitality AFCON.



Côte d'Ivoire on the rise

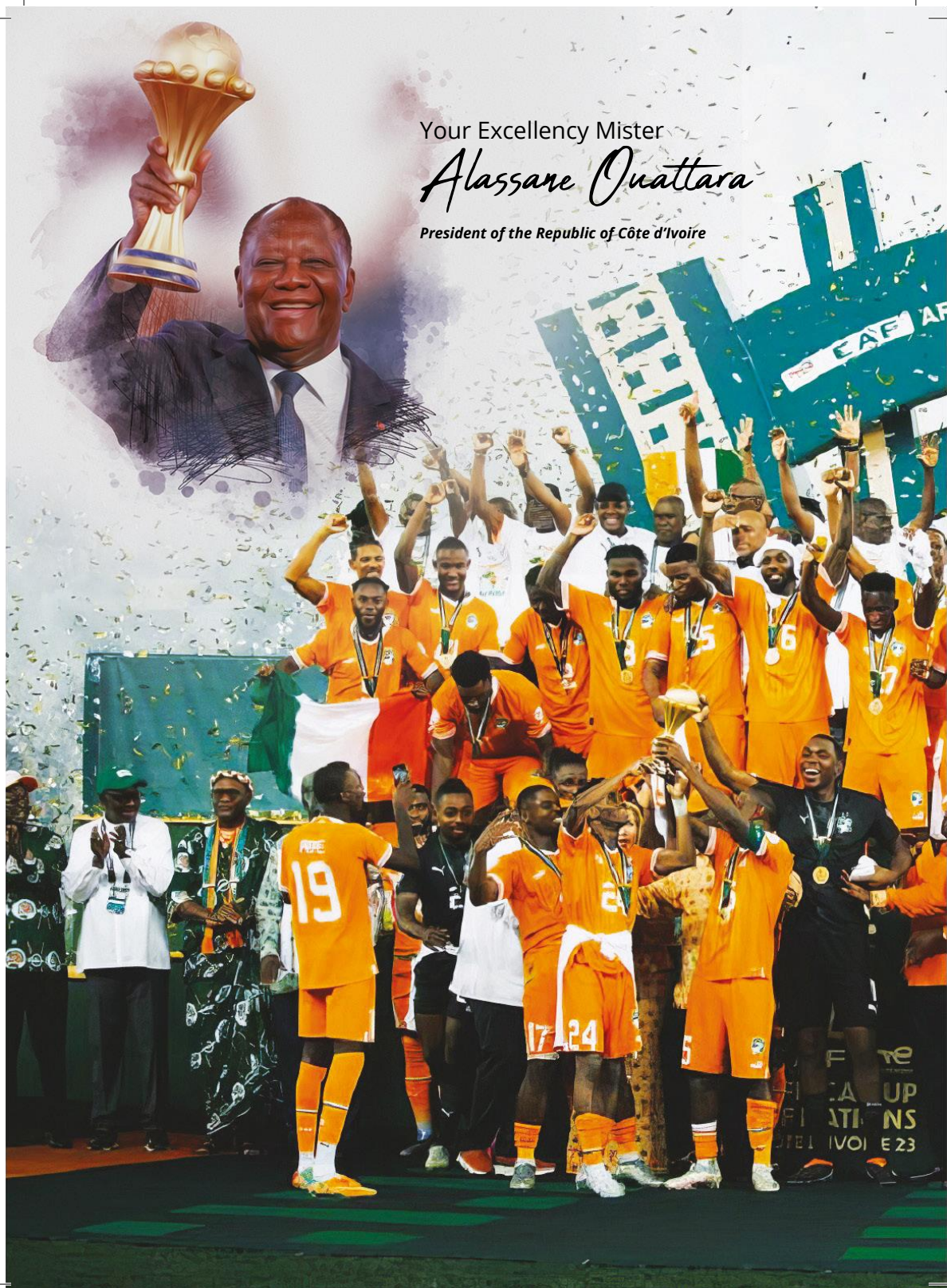

The pearl of the lagoons

When you think of Abidjan, you probably think of major international meetings.

But Abidjan is much more than business tourism. It's a city that reveals itself with a rich history, a vibrant culture, a traditional culinary art, between street food and afro-fusion and finally, a striking urban biodiversity. Abidjan has no shortage of relevant stories to tell. Plunge into the heart of the city to find your happiness. Bordered by the Gulf of Guinea and dotted with lagoons, Abidjan is Côte d'Ivoire's most populous agglomeration with its **6,321,017 inhabitants (RGPH 2021)**.

This district stretches energetically over 2119km², with ten communes. The names are distinguishable from each other (Abobo, Adjamé, Attécoubé, Cocody, Koumassi, Marcory, Plateau, Port-Bouët, Treichville, Yopougon), and four sub-regions (Anyama, Bingerville, Brofodoumé, Songon). For a long time now, Abidjan has been the administrative center of the country, but above all, it produces the bulk of the country's economic wealth: it's the business center, along with the Plateau Commune. The history of Abidjan rhymes with that of the "Place de la République" and its statue « **The Iron Lady** », which stands at the entrance of Plateau and welcomes all visitors. Formerly Place LAPALUD (**Maurice-Pierre LAPALUD: Governor of the colony in 1916**), built in 1957 and inaugurated on March 15, 1958, in conjunction with the Félix Houphouët-Boigny bridge, this square is renamed Place de la République (or Place of the Indépendance), to commemorate the independence of Côte d'Ivoire, on **August 7, 1960**.



The soul of the city

As for the "Iron Lady", she symbolizes the name given to the locality at the time "Abidjan". Encountered by colonists during a recognition of places around the Ebrié lagoon towards Anoumabo, this Tchaman woman carrying a basket of leaves on her head replied « **min tchan m'bidjan** », which can be translated as: « **I cut leaves** », to the question asked: « **where do you come from?** ». Stadium Félix Houphouët-Boigny

In the heart of Abidjan, the Stadium Félix Houphouët-Boigny, affectionately nicknamed 'Félicia', is a historic site. Originally named Stade Géo André, it was completely renovated and renamed in honor of the nation's first president shortly after the country's independence. With a capacity of 29,000, this multi-purpose stadium hosts soccer, athletics and other sports.

Step 1 : Abidjan

Day 1

Le Plateau

Access a masterpiece of Ivorian independence thanks to the extraordinary architecture of this monument, imagined for the glory of a woman mounted on a pedestal, holding a basket full of leaves on her head. The Grand Mosque, with its captivating blue dome, invites you to follow in the footsteps of architects Koffi & Diabaté. Up Boulevard of Republic, you'll find a sky-blue trail to one of Côte d'Ivoire's architectural marvels, the atypical Cathédrale Saint-Paul of Plateau. A journey into the past takes you just a few meters away to the Museum of Civilizations of Côte d'Ivoire, opened in 1942, which exhibits one of the finest ethnographic collections of masks, statues and furniture. The cable-stayed bridge and the cornice promenade complete the futuristic vision of Plateau.

or the Domaine Bini with its clay bath as a bonus. On a deckchair or in a hammock, what could be more pleasant than reading a book by Marguerite ABOUET to meet the mythical Aya de Yopougon ? If you don't go there, you'll immediately be transported.

Day 2

In the Commune of Cocody

Let us take you to the Floristic National Centre nestled within the University Félix Houphouët-Boigny, an estate of over ten hectares (10.35 ha), in search of iboga and the family of discreet red-flanked deer! Next, we head for Baie de Marcène, in the village of Blockhauss, one of the 60 villages of the Tchaman people who resist urbanization in the area of Cocody.

Day 3

Experience either a unique site, the 3438 Ha Banco National Park erected in 1963 in the heart of Abidjan straddling 4 municipalities Adjamé, Attécoubé, Abobo and Yopougon to discover a stunning biodiversity,

ARTBOBO - Introduction to contemporary art

The Musée des Cultures Contemporaines Adama Toungara (MUCAT) is a cultural Mecca conceived and designed as a multifunctional space, offering a multi-faceted cultural experience. This 3500 m² architectural work, designed by renowned architect Issa Diabaté, aims to integrate and coordinate all approaches, and to anchor the project in its urban context. The MUCAT in Abobo is the first contemporary art museum in Côte d'Ivoire. The challenge to be met is to ensure that the facility make contemporary art and culture accessible even for disadvantage families.

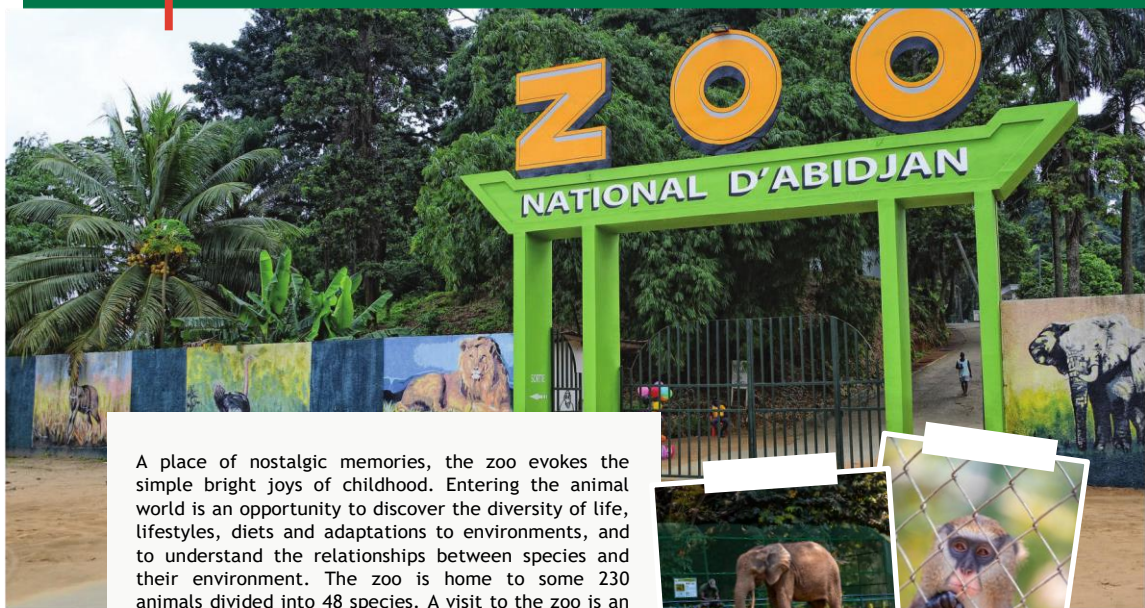

Step 1 : Abidjan



A place of nostalgic memories, the zoo evokes the simple bright joys of childhood. Entering the animal world is an opportunity to discover the diversity of life, lifestyles, diets and adaptations to environments, and to understand the relationships between species and their environment. The zoo is home to some 230 animals divided into 48 species. A visit to the zoo is an introduction to preserving the environment, respecting nature and safeguarding species in an eco-responsible way, with the aim of making our beautiful country a sustainable, responsible and equitable tourist destination.



There are two types of giant tortoise coming from Galapagos and Seychelles. At Abidjan National Zoo, the one we have is the Seychelles giant tortoise.

Her name is Aimée and she weighs 350 kgs.

She has a special history, as she has lived in 3 African countries, and during her stay in these countries, she resided with Heads of State (Sierra Leone, Liberia, Côte d'Ivoire). The late President Félix Houphouët-Boigny donated her to the Abidjan National Zoo in 1980, where she remains to this day. She is 125 years old to be precise, and feeds with fruits, vegetables and leaves. She's just waiting for you to take some historic photos.

Step 2: The Center



Day 1

Yamoussoukro the village of Yamoussou says **Mo!** Lunch in a restaurant, or for a change of scenery, head to Wolf's maquis to discover the boli papoué! Then a visit to the **Basilica Our Lady of Peace**, the world's largest religious building, an architectural jewel of the highest quality, designed by Pierre Fakhoury, the Basilica invites you to meditate and explore. Then, let yourself be tempted by an exotic adventure in the heart of the city. Take a walk along the lakes for an introduction to caimans and crocodiles. Urban lakes are important for the conservation of water and land birds. They have a rich and diverse avifauna of 33 species in 10 families. You'll be enriched by this ecotourism observation activity.

Day 2

On the way to Bomizambo and Kondéyaokro, visit the Baoulé loincloth weavers. Wonderful souvenirs to take home.

Day 3

Tiassalé, timeless in Agnéby-Tiassa with DANY's Travels. The beautiful arched bridge at the entrance to the town, built in 1934, is Tiassalé's signature. Tourism of memory, this historic town takes you back in time. Follow in the footsteps of Captain MANNET, who drowned in Ellosso with his crew, in the waters of the Bandama River. Stop at KANGA NIANZE, a major witness to the history of slavery in Côte d'Ivoire. Our guide will take you on an emotional tour.

Day 4

Swiss Tropical Plantation. This 500-hectare estate offers a magnificent backdrop, with its long rows of century-old trees and plantations of cocoa, rubber and food crops... For even more fun, you can take a tuk tuk ride, stopping at strategic points. The banks of the Bandama River invite you to sample typical ivorian dishes, before lounging on hammocks, rocked by the river's rapids.

Day 5

From Cocoa at Kokoumbo-Tiémorokro to Chocolate by Les Douceurs de Suzanne. The chocolate route will have no secrets for you.

Day 6

A very special canoe ride on the Bandama River offers a calm and relaxing landscape, with different species of birds blending into the scenery. This enchanting environment invites you to search for the ears of the famous Hippopotamus of the region. To round off the day in true ivorian style, your dinner will be enhanced by an evening of dancing to the sound of traditional music.

Day 7

AHOUAKRO. Its unique archaeological park preserves the remains of a distant Paleolithic era. Through the process of erosion, the stones have taken on surprising natural shapes and configurations. You'll see tool-sharpening marks, striated monuments, polishing workshops and rocks with decorative walls. The extraordinary on-site guide will make you experience the visit in a very fun way. Not far from the park, the banks of an artificial lake welcome your chic picnic, prepared with originality by Fine Bouche. Relaxation guaranteed. A dinner with interactive dancing will round off your evening.

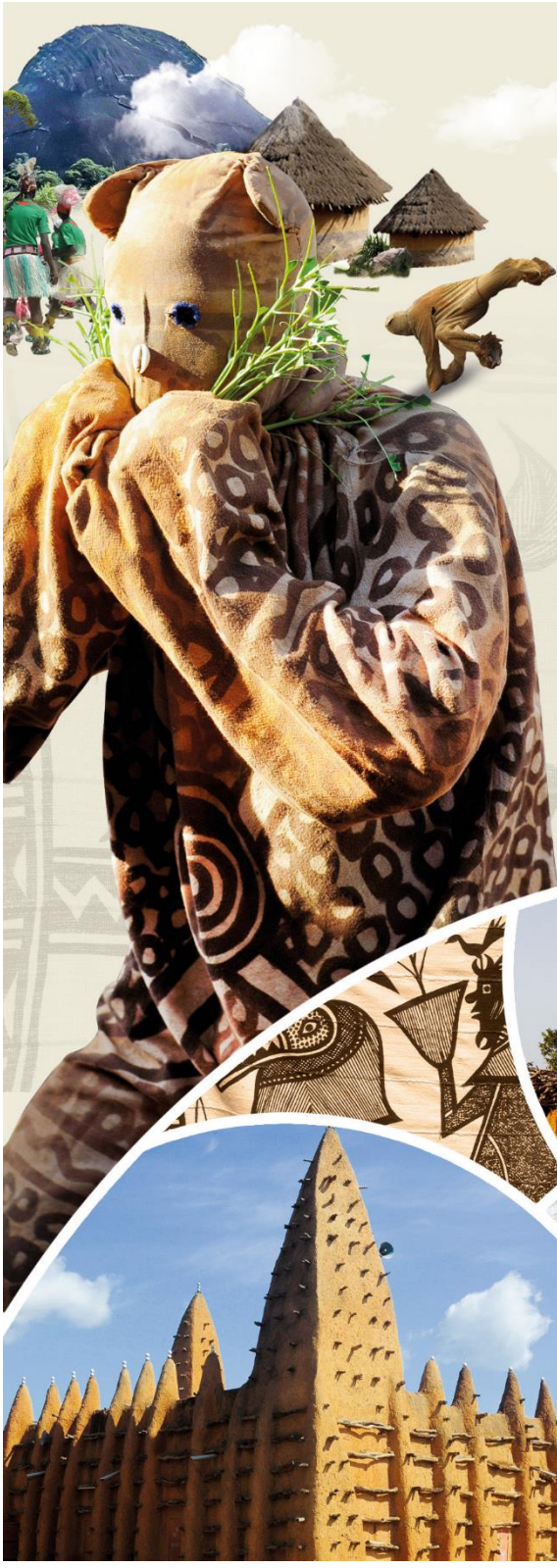

Step 3 : The North



Day 1

By road to the North, a stop in cosmopolitan Bouaké invites you to discover powdered clay on a guided tour of Tanou-Sakassou. Katiola will welcome you and share with you the fascinating world of Mangoros potters, a women's business. You'll join women's associations as they make terracotta canaries, an ancestral art that stands the test of time. A stop at the ceramics center to contemplate contemporary vases will demonstrate the symbiosis between local culture and western craftsmanship put forward by the artisans. The rest of the route will take us through vast stretches of savannah dotted with cashew and shea trees, leading to Foubolo and the discovery of the sacred mountain where metal is forbidden. Prior authorization required!

Day 2

A journey through time guaranteed in Kong, a city of memory, from prosperity to destruction. Almamy SAMORY TOURE passed through here, and his history is still very much present. A singular place, Kong has kept its Sudanese imprint with its large and small Mosques, both listed as UNESCO World Heritage Sites (2021). At the end of the day, an overnight stay in the city will inevitably plunge you into a world of emotions. At sunrise, what traveler could fail to visit the 1,148,756-hectare Comoé National Park, also a UNESCO World Heritage site (1983) and biosphere reserve.

Day 3

Another city of discoveries is Ferkessédougou, capital of the Tchologo region, and an important crossroads for the countries of the hinterland. Ferkessédougou boasts sugarcane and cotton plantations and a dry port, an asset for its development.

Day 4

Head to Korhogo, the heart of Senufo country and its Poro, which means heritage, to hear about the rites and dances of this initiatory society that passes on knowledge and wisdom. A stopover in Fakaha and the famous Korhogo canvases, in colors derived from nature, for an immersion in this craft featuring animal-totems and human figures. Then Waraniéré, where weavers and sculptors will guide your choice for a souvenir to buy. Why not the magnificent clay beads? On the road to M'Bengué, Koni, the stronghold of the blacksmiths, takes you on an exceptional journey to meet the last iron-extracting blacksmiths. To end the day, it is with stars in your eyes that you will experience an evening in a moonlight to the sound of the balafon supported by cowrie-decorated calabashes. The Boloye show or panther dance, will enhance your evening. A dance that would make the rain fall?

Day 5

You'll drop off your suitcases at the Lokoli Ecological Farm, a delightful riverside spot along the Bandama River, for guaranteed moments of relaxation. A window opens onto the world of farming, where you'll discover a peaceful setting and local produce.

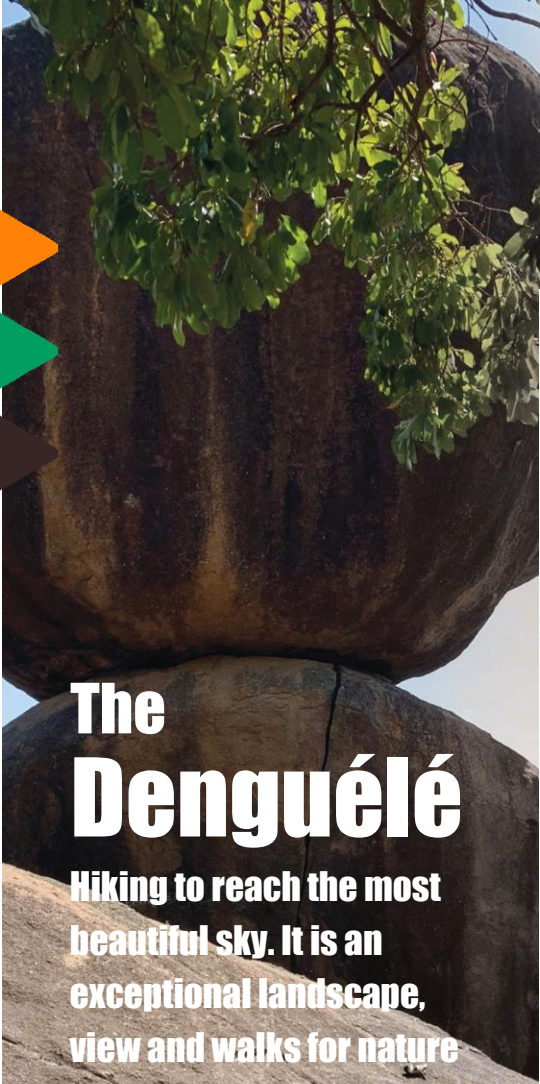

The Denguélé

Hiking to reach the most beautiful sky. It is an exceptional landscape, view and walks for nature lovers.

Day 1

On my way to Odienné, a stopover in Boundiali to explore the region of La Bagoué is a must. During raining season, the green landscape invites visitors and the road from Korhogo to Boundiali give travelers a good insight, rolling landscape with various waterways and rivers. If you are looking for hippos, just drive to Tengréla to La Bagoué river to admire them.

Day 2

For the more adventurous, look for the mystical Lake of Kouto and its legend. Dance troupes compete to present the best Ngoron and Poro initiation rites, a concept of life within the limits of what can be shared.

Day 3

Departure for Tiémé to discover René Caillié's hut and the rifle he gave to his benefactor. On his way to Timbuktu in the early 19th century, he fell ill with scurvy. The local population took care of him until he recovered. He built a monument to mark his passage. Tiémé, the colorful town, is the origin of colored fabrics. Admire the expanses of Indigo, which grows naturally and is used for dyeing.

Day 4

Wake up to the excitement in the air as you set out to explore Tiémé's hidden treasure. Start your day of adventure with a sensational visit to the heart of nature and biodiversity at Domaine Souzel of Tiémé.

In this natural sanctuary, marvel at the Souzel Mini-zoo, where exotic animals awaken your senses to the magic of local wildlife. Continue your journey by discovering the delights of Agrotourism through the vast fields of cashew, mango and corn trees that paint the landscape with their shimmering hues.

Day 5

The village of the great hunter Samatigui Koné, master of elephants. Samatiguila is a great Koranic intellectual center, welcoming pupils and talibés from all over the world to acquire knowledge. It also houses Vacaba Touré's memorabilia, his hero's weapons. A short stroll further north reveals "here it will succeed" or "min- ni-gnan", now the town of Minignan. Here, we can follow in the footsteps of René Caillié and Samory Touré. The story will be told!

Day 6

Odienné, the town of a thousand hills, with its charm accentuated by the many orchards. The Mont Denguélé mountain and hills are magnificent. Odienné was a lookout point for the French colonists and for a long time served as a refuge for the local population. For fishing enthusiasts, a small lake invites you to celebrate your hidden talents. From sport walks to discovery walks and wellness walks, a walk on Mont Denguélé is a chance to discover the fauna, flora and cultural heritage of the area.

Day 7

Calling all nature lovers!

On the way to Toutié, 25 km from Touba, you'll stop off in the charming town of Ouaninou. The village of Toutié is located 2 km from Ouaninou and is home to 3 cases where a Zen atmosphere reigns. The Lafiani cave, which means "cave with 2 holes". One entrance and one exit. Here, you'll discover bats and learn about the history of the region. The 2nd cave, named Layani meaning darkness, has an exit that's hard to reach. And the 3rd Lagbouni cave, or hole with no exit, ends your visit to Toutié.

Day 8

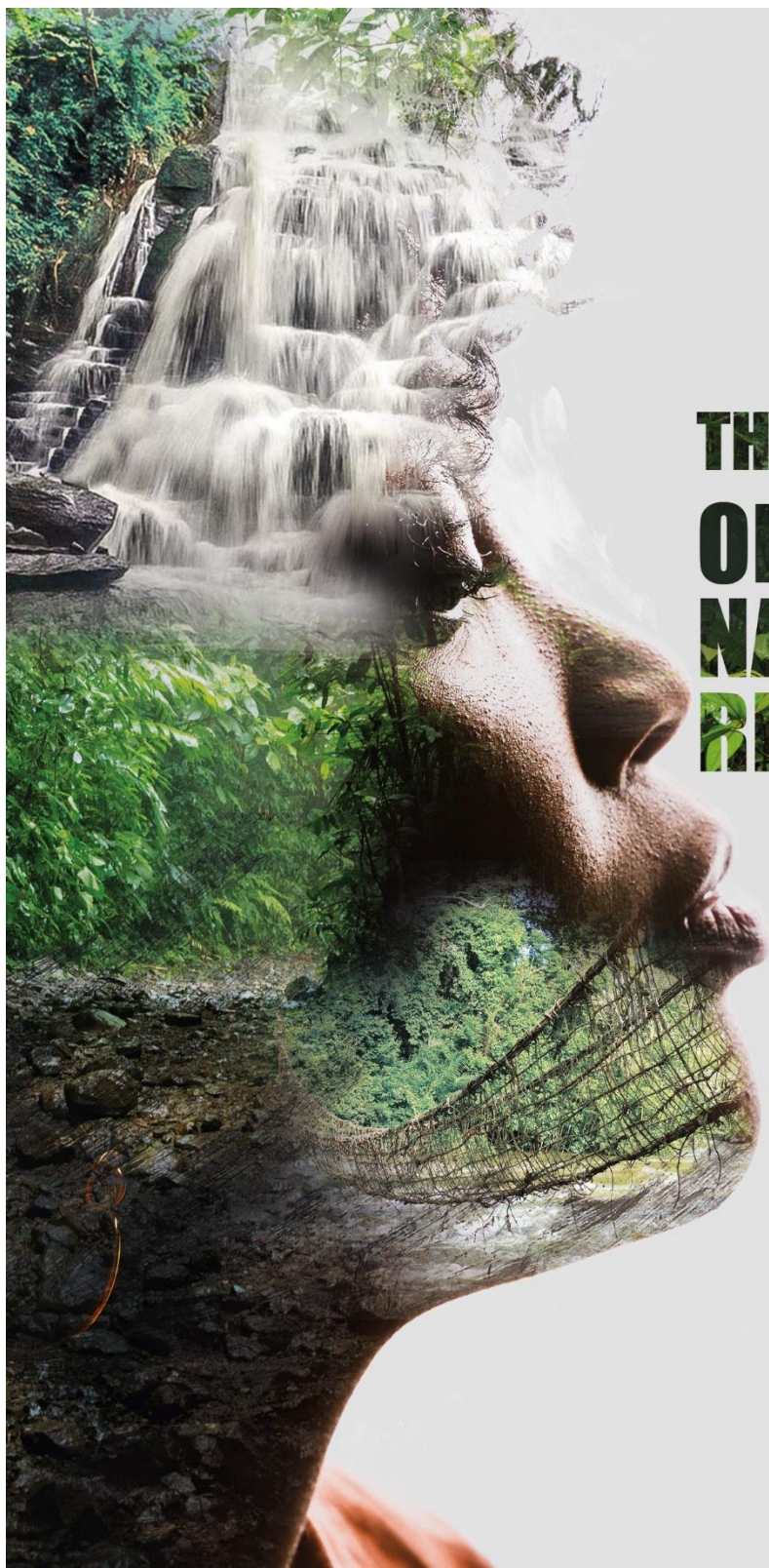
Mahou mysticism and animism take us on a journey to Silakoro and Zala.

Located around 15 km from Touba, Silakoro has its own sacred fish pond. The Silakoro catfish are believed to embody the souls of the ancestors who are worshipped by the local people. If you're lucky, you'll be able to meet the Youanigbé people of Zala, who welcome you with their rich culture and art, or listen to the singing stones of Gbenimenso and Gatasso. The moonlit evening in Touba distills the sounds of the Mahou people and their dances.

Day 9

The Mont Sangbé park boasts a wide variety of biodiversity and incredible natural landscapes that are sure to amaze you. Fascinating fauna awaits you, including elephants, leopards, hippopotragues, etc. Straddling three towns: Touba, Biankouma and Séguéla, it covers an area of 97554 hectares. Its landscape is characterized by idyllic valleys. A hike or mountain-bike ride will enable you to get to grips with this almost untouched wild ecosystem.

Let's put on our sneakers, grab the little backpack and let's go!

Step 7: The South-Comoé



Day 1

Remembrance tourism with the Colonial Tour in the heart of Grand-Bassam's quartier France, which has become a place of remembrance. To round off the day, a visit to the N'Zimah Kotoko and Mossou villages immerses you in the culture of royalty.

Day 2

Assinie Mafia, seaside resort.

The Îles Ehotilé National Park, classified as a RAMSAR site in 2005 and a UNESCO World Heritage Site in 2006, covers 722 hectares. This group of six islands is scattered across the Aby lagoon (Assoco- Monobaha, Balouaté, Mea, Niamouan, Elouamin and the sacred island of Bosson-Assoum).

The walk takes us to discover several species of forest birds and endangered manatees, as well as 17th-century cannons, ritual sites and royal burial grounds. The day is rounded off by a visit to the mouth of the river and lunch in a heavenly setting.



Day 3

Stopover in Elima, the cocoa-growing region and home to the remains of the first school in Côte d'Ivoire, founded by the Frenchman Arthur VERDIER. To recover from your emotions, enjoy a N'douhan, a specialty of braised fish with steamed manioc, in a maquis area.



Day 4

Ayamé, the Monin Bia palace, by Dominique KANGA, is perched on a hilltop with a spectacular view over the River Bia. Ayamé also boasts an artificial lake and the Ayamé 1 and 2 dams, making it a pleasant detour.

The Zanzan

Day 1

Bondoukou, the city of a thousand mosques.

The Bondoukou Museum of Arts and Traditions is the town's identity. Listed as a historic monument, its four entrances correspond to the four points of the compass. The Musée de la Paix (Museum of Peace), located on the town's first market, is a must-see, as is the Bondoukou first house, a symbol of traditional architecture and the region's past. The ruins of the house that once housed Louis-Gustave Binger will not fail to edify you. Having left Assinie in 1888, he stayed here from December 4 to 20 and was cared for by his host, Sitapha Ouattara, two months after Marcel Treich-Lapleine's visit. A stroll through the old town takes you to the house of Almamy Samory Touré. In 1897, Samory seized Bondoukou. King Adjoumani gave him 700 kg of gold and sofas to avoid war. This residence was built by a wealthy merchant, Aboukary Touré. Measuring just under 50 m², it was built with a single storey. Sirakani, son of Samory, settled in Bondoukou with his 2 daughters and two of his wives.

Day 2

The 18th-century Sorobango Mosque is built in Sudanese style. It is built of banco bricks supported by wooden beams. A religious edifice, an architectural gem not to be missed. A short stop on the way back at Kanguélé, a weaving village inhabited by the Koulangos and Abrons. They have a long tradition of weaving, which has been perpetuated for generations.

Day 3

Pottery initiation with the potters of Motiamo. This Dêgha village, specialized in the art of pottery, has been a women's business for generations. Ancestral know-how handed down from mother to daughter.

Step 8: The Zanzan



A stopover in Bondoukou with craftsmen who are able to work wood and produce exceptional pieces. Relax to the sound of the Kété dance from the Bron region. A dance with significant gestures expressing greatness and cohesion to the sound of tam-tams.

Day 4

A love of monkeys takes us to Soko, a village shared by the inhabitants and Vervets monkeys. The legend, told by the villagers, leads us to Samory Touré. The village of Sapia, a Nafana village, recounts the legend of the sacred fish that got angry and left.

Day 5

From Koulangos to Lobis, Bouna.

Gateway to the Comoé National Park, Bouna is a quiet little town. But it hasn't always been so. A brief foray into history takes us back to Almamy Samory Touré. At the end of 1896, he destroyed the Kingdom of Bouna, whose population was reduced, according to Binger, from almost 10,000 to around 1,000.

Bouna's wealth lies in its dance festivals, such as the Naya, the Lossinaga and its traditional Dongbô diguê or yam festival, which takes place in the last week of October; the Kroubi, as in Bondoukou, is held three days before the Ramadan feast. Djôrô, the initiation rite of the Lobis, takes place every 7 years on the banks of the Volta Noire and lasts 3 months.

A visit to the century-old Sudanese-style mosque known as the Samory Touré Mosque

A short detour to Pouon, to visit the region's most beautiful soukhalas. For architecture buffs, these are open-air living rooms representing the Lobi habitat.

Day 6

On the way to Tehini to visit its colonial quarter, we make a point of stopping off at Tingo-Yalo, now Yalo, to visit the mystical caves and sacred rocks of Gbadjdouo.

Day 7

The picturesque banks of the Black Volta River welcome you for a well-watered country lunch!

A charming passage over the Vonkoro bridge offers a splendid view of the Black Volta.

I won't go home without a souvenir of the local crafts!

1. Finely chop onion, garlic and parsley.

3. Marinate your well-cleaned crabs with your seasoning.
4. Place crabs on grill.
5. Braise both sides.

THE BANDJI

Palm wine is an alcoholic beverage obtained from the natural fermentation of palm sap. It is a traditional drink. The sap is extracted from African oil palms (*Elaeis guineensis*), raffia (*Raphia vinifera*) and roasters (*Borassus aethiopicum*), and when freshly harvested, the juice is milky-white, mild and rather sweet. As the hours go by and fermentation increases, the wine produced becomes sparkling, strong, sometimes bitter, and takes on a darker hue. It's also called Bangui or Bandji.

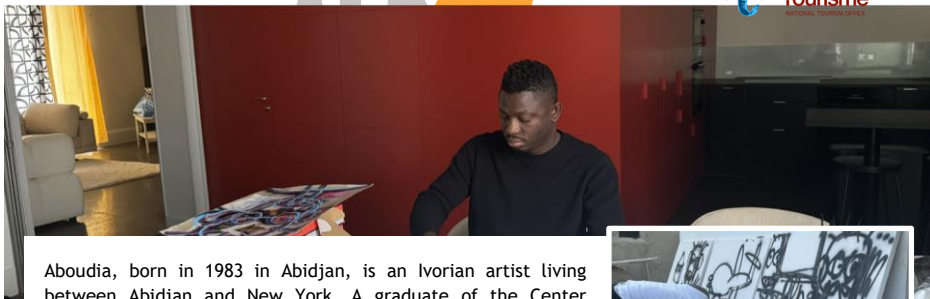


Jacob BLEU

His unique, modern creations combine design and sculpture, drawing inspiration from an ancestral practice where aesthetics and functionality meet. Primarily using coconut wood, which has become his signature material, he also values other fragile materials to create striking furniture. His work has been shown worldwide in galleries, museums and international events, winning several awards, including Best Design Piece at the Beirut Design Art Fair in 2019. In 2021, he launched the “Young Designers Workshop” to train a new generation of Ivorian designers. In 2024, he opened Maison N’Zima, a residence for artist in Grand- Bassam.

The currency is the CFA franc, in the form of 250 FCFA, 100 FCFA, 50 FCFA, 25 FCFA, 10 FCFA and 5 FCFA coins, and 10,000 FCFA, 5,000 FCFA, 2,000 FCFA, 1,000 FCFA and 500 FCFA banknotes. The CFA franc is linked to the Euro at a fixed parity. 1 euro is equivalent to 655 FCFA.

In Côte d'Ivoire, there are thirty banks and over 500 ATMs throughout the country. International VISA and Mastercard payment cards are accepted, as are shopping malls, modern stores and local boutiques. For a change of scenery, browsing the markets invites you to haggle and negotiate to buy an item.

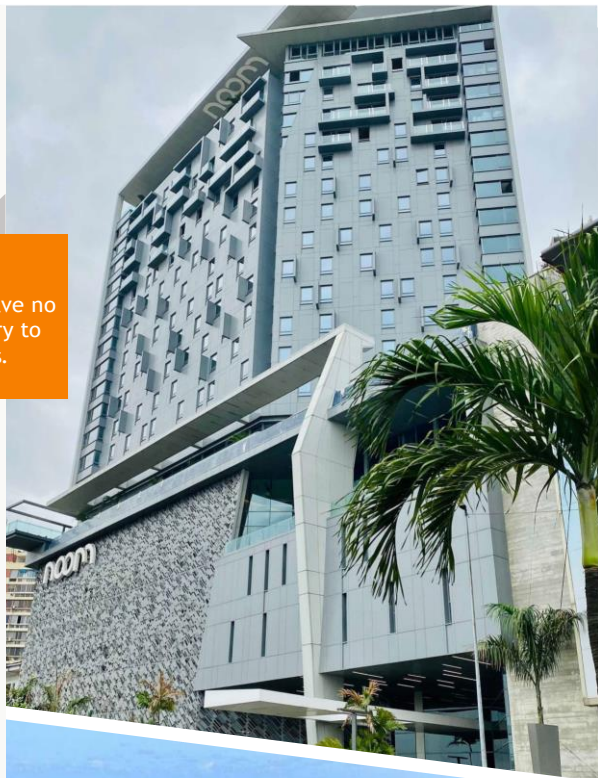

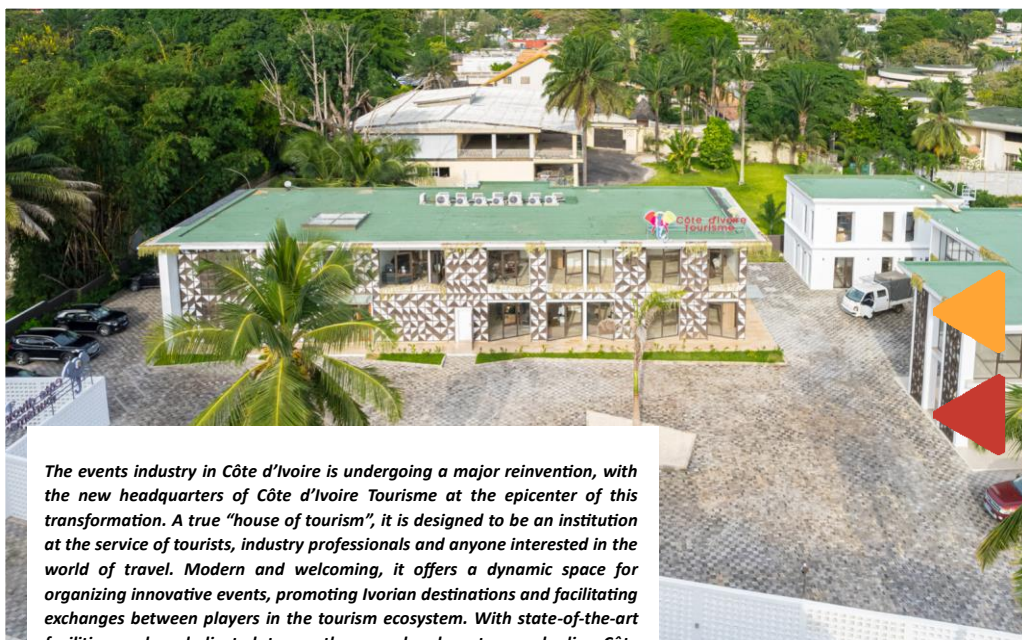
Tam Sir

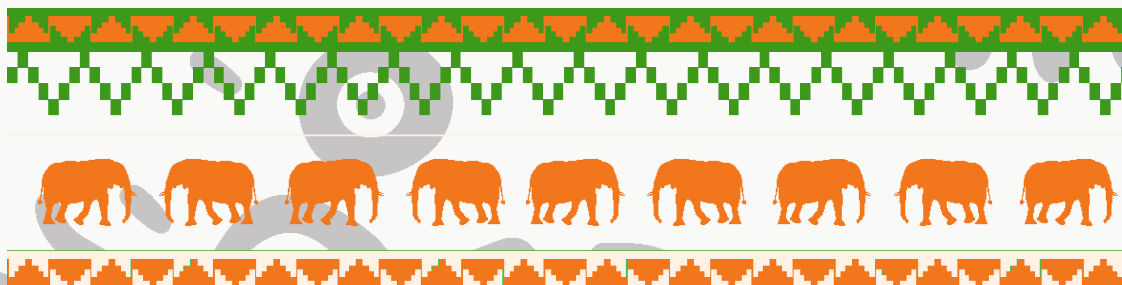

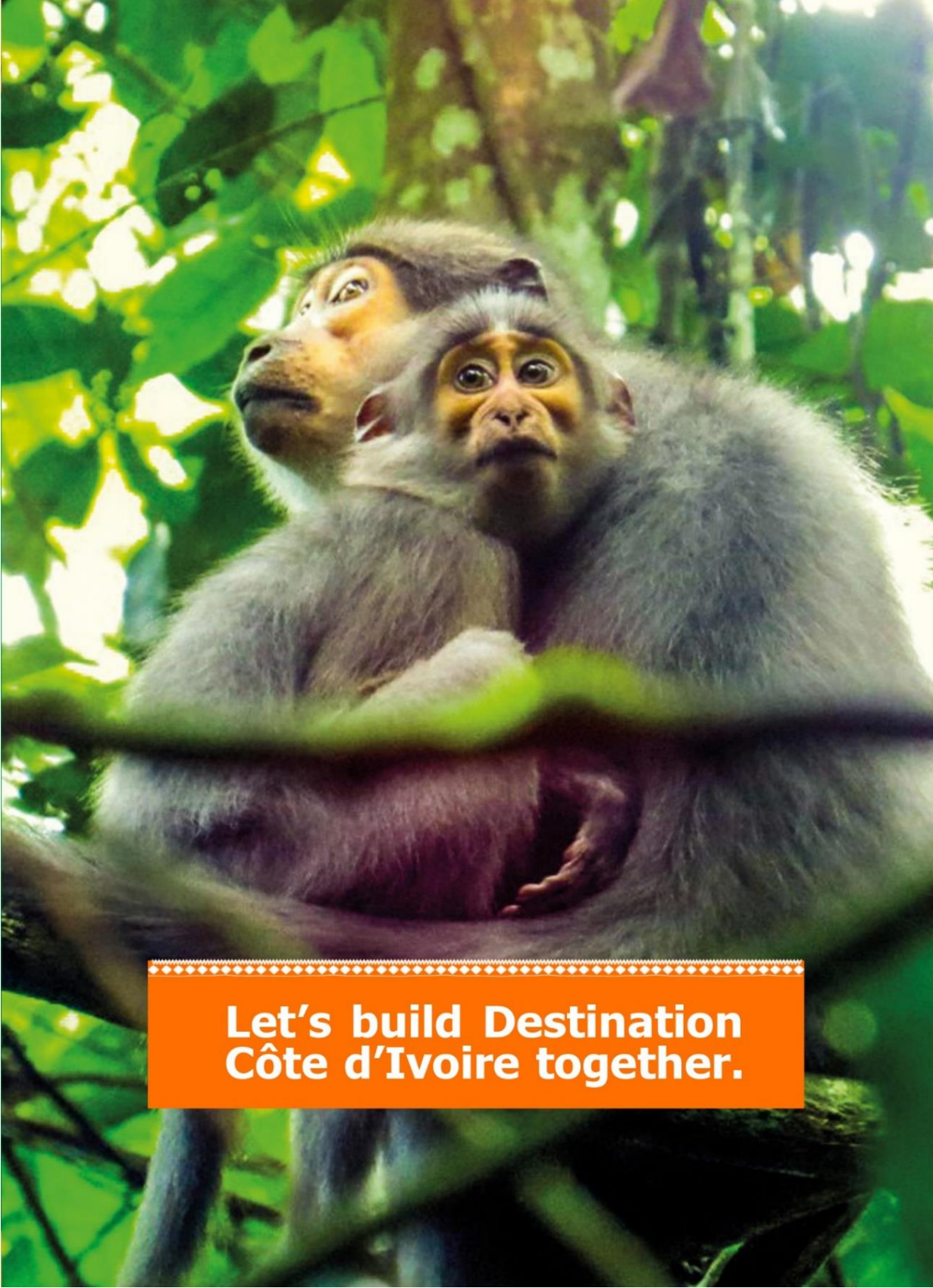
